Celebrate the 200th Anniversary of the National Road All Day Field Trip for Third Graders



Tollhouse (National Highway) - Students will see how the tollhouse keeper lived and worked at the only tollhouse on the National Road in Maryland still standing. Depending on class size approximately 1/2 hour.

Queen City Transportation Museum (210 S. Centre Street) - students will map out their journey on the National Road, pack for the journey, and make a covered wagon. 2 hours at \$3/ student

Gordon-Roberts House - hear the story of a family traveling westward and the memory quilt they made, make a classroom quilt, and stencil a quilt bookmark. 1 and 1/2 hours at \$3/ student
